This compressor has a homemade regulator. The compressor works fine and holds a primary charge for many hours. There is a slow leak in the regulator that eventually drains the charge if left turned off for extended periods. The full charge is 150# and the regulator will adjust output over the full range but is sometimes fussy to set but is OK for most jobs.

Having now been through the shop in detail, I have decided that I need to sell the whole shop in bulk, rather than piecemeal. I have set below a partial list of the items that are in the shop, and I would be prepared to make a bulk sale of all of it for \$3,000 or best offer, with the understanding that the purchaser would take everything that is there.

I would be selling everything as is. I have not used any of the equipment, but I believe the power tools to be in good condition. It has been stored in a dry garage since my Dad stopped using it in 2005 or so. He was an engineer at the Arnold Engineering and Development Center and took good care of it all. All in all, there are several hundred items - tools, tables, and boxes of supplies. I've listed the power tools and a few other things that I was able to identify below, but there is much more. If you or someone in the club or someone they know would be interested in acquiring the contents of the shop, I can make arrangements for it to be viewed the afternoon of June 2 or on Sunday June 3. If you are only interested in an item or two, I'd be happy to sell some individual pieces, but only if I can't arrange a bulk sale of the whole thing, which is my first preference.

Some of the items included are:

- 1 Mark V Shopsmith
- 1 Shopsmith 12 inch planer mounted on metal table
- 1 Shopsmith Band saw mounted on homemade wooden table
- bench-top router table with Craftsman router, mounted on table with band saw
- 1 Bosch plunge router
